SALT TO THE EARTH, LIGHT TO THE WORLD

What is it that drives forward our world's great economies? Finance? Resources? Energy? Productivity? Effort? The material world needs all of these and more to move onwards from day to day, to preserve and advance the lifestyles to which we are accustomed. But what about those times when it all goes wrong? What happens when the great banks collapse, when the crops fail or where the land is flooded and livelihoods all but destroyed? Then come into play the more noble attributes of our humanity: care, support, sharing—stepping back from our own needs and recognising the greater needs of others. Then the Gospel message of mutual love and support comes more clearly into focus, and its relevance for modern times is beyond doubt.

But the teaching of Jesus does not begin and end with care and support for our fellow human beings in material crisis. More deeply, Jesus speaks of another human need which goes beyond economic welfare and the sharing of wealth and resources. His Gospel also teaches us of a hope that cannot be destroyed by storms, cannot be stolen by thieves, cannot be dashed by human tragedy or loss. This is a hope for eternity which inspires us to look beyond the limited world we see; a knowledge of Christ's presence which never permits of loneliness; an understanding of the free gift of spiritual joy which money cannot buy. And here, our Christian mission to live out our faith—to be salt to the earth, and light to the world—does not come to an end when our charitable deeds are done.

Day by day, we are called simply to 'be' Christians—to share our Faith publicly in the little things we do and in the ways we live and speak. As St Paul tells us in today's second Reading, it does not demand of us great eloquence. Nor does it demand that we lash out at everyone and everything that does not agree with us, and be unholy nuisances in the process! Just simply 'be'. And if our lives are properly ordered, if prayer has its proper place, and if our eyes are kept open to the pain and suffering around us, then our being—and its consequences for good—will be enough. Let God do the rest.

STREET PASTORS

Street pastors are an inter-denominational group of Christians who go out, working in twos, living the Gospel message and offering care and support to people in need on the streets—more people than you might imagine. Sadly, their ministry in Eccles is under threat from a shortage of volunteers. Next Sunday (February 15th) we will be welcoming Christine Leach, from Street Pastors, to speak after Holy Communion at the 11.15am and 6.30pm Masses, to tell us about their work and how fulfilling this ministry can be for those willing to give a little of their time.
